Your historical time travel through 330 YEARS OF MIGRATION HISTORY takes you from the pier in Bremerhaven to New York via authentic replicas of locations and interactive media stations. Fascinating life stories and unique museum artifacts provide an insight into the emigrants' everyday life.

In the new part of the exhibition, you will learn about GERMANY AS A COUNTRY OF IMMIGRATION from many perspectives: How did immigrants build their lives for themselves here? Discover their impressive stories. How has society shaped coexistence? Answers are provided through social debates and individual life plans.

Experience History Interactively

Experience emigration and immigration history USING ALL YOUR SENSES with the help of interactive technology. Digital flip books provide deeper insights. Room sounds enable immersion in other worlds. Easy-to-use media stations captivate with audio and videos.

The new CRITICAL THINKING STATIONS open up digital spaces for thought, where you can discover and explore opinions. The survey results are presented anonymously on a large screen in the MIGRATION FORUM.

The German Emigration Center is a BARRIER-FREE MUSEUM. All areas are easily accessible via elevators and wide corridors for visitors with limited mobility. The museum also has two folding wheelchairs that can be borrowed free of charge. Trained guide dogs are permitted. For people with hearing disabilities, printed texts of selected biographies are available at the museum ticket counter. Please schedule sign language and tactile tours in advance.
